1) Competition rules reminder

- FCE Secretary General reminded all participants to comply with competition law and circulated FCE antitrust and competition compliance policy.

2) Status update – where do we currently stand?

- Corpore provided an overview of recent political developments, highlighting that a new coalition government took office in late March. The new government is currently facing low public support.

- The Ministry of Climate and the Tax Board commented on FCE's proposed amendment to the Liquid Fuel Act (LFA), indicating that the Ministry is now committed to pursuing changes to the law.
- Once the Ministry finalizes the draft amendment, both intra-ministerial and public consultations will be conducted. Following this, the proposal will be presented to the Estonian government for approval. If approved, the draft legislation will be submitted to Parliament and go through three readings.
- Corpore believes that if the draft is finalized promptly, it could be submitted before the summer.

3) Q&A with the Climate Ministry – clarifying the comments

- TGS Baltics reviewed the Ministry of Climate's comments on FCE's proposed amendment to the Liquid Fuel Act (LFA) and the draft responses they had prepared, discussing the most significant points with members of the working group.

Action

TGS Baltics will circulate the final draft by the end of the day.

Members are requested to submit any final comments by close of business on Monday 14 April.

4) Next steps – how to proceed with the Climate Ministry?

Action

TGS Baltics will submit FCE's responses to the Ministry of Climate's written comments on the proposed LFA amendments before Easter.

Corpore will maintain close contact with Anastassia Batulin from the Ministry of Climate to monitor their reaction to FCE's replies and to clarify the next steps.

5) AOB

- Participants agreed to schedule a follow-up meeting in early May.
