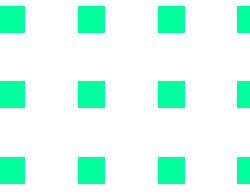


STRENGTHENING FCE TO DELIVER GREATER IMPACT

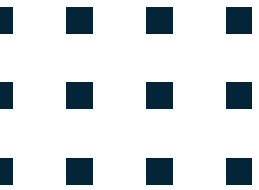
In 2025, FCE strengthened its position in Brussels, enhancing its capacity to deliver for its members and voicing their interests at the EU level. A key milestone was the appointment of a Secretary General, Aurélie Decker Peigneur, establishing a dedicated Secretariat in Brussels.

During this pivotal period, FCE continued to advance its mission, driven by the outstanding voluntary engagement of its members.





FCE met with EU Institutions and national Permanent Representations on the Payment Package, securing the safeguarding of the Limited Network Exclusion (LNE), and engaged with the European Commission to clarify the treatment of fuel cards under PSD2.

FCE monitored the national implementation of the VEGA Guidelines, ensuring their safe implementation in further countries like Denmark, Germany, the Netherlands and Slovakia.

FCE also held preliminary discussions on the national implementation of ETS2; and created a tracker on e-invoicing and e-reporting requirements in the EU Member States.

FCE contributed to stakeholder platforms such as the European Commission's Sustainable Transport Forum.

We monitored key policy initiatives, including the Industrial Action Plan for the Automotive Sector and related legislative developments. We also contributed to public consultations and calls for evidence in these areas; and published a position paper on the decarbonisation of commercial road transport.

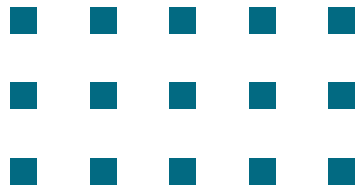

FCE members held a dedicated meeting to assess the implications of U.S. sanctions targeting state-backed and private Russian oil firms.





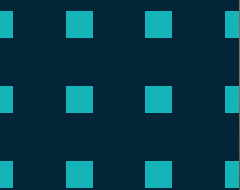
HIGHLIGHTS

In November, FCE conducted a survey of its members satisfaction with the organisation's operations, gathering their suggestions and feedback

Most members (85%) replied, highly valued FCE's activities, governance, communications, or meeting frequency with scores on average all over 4 out of 5.

This listening process identified three areas of further work:

- a strategic pivot in 2026 towards high-level engagement in Brussels to get more access to policy-makers,
- immediate development of a communications strategy,
- potentially structural changes to maximise FCE's impact and profile in the European mobility landscape.

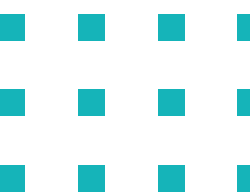

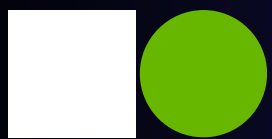
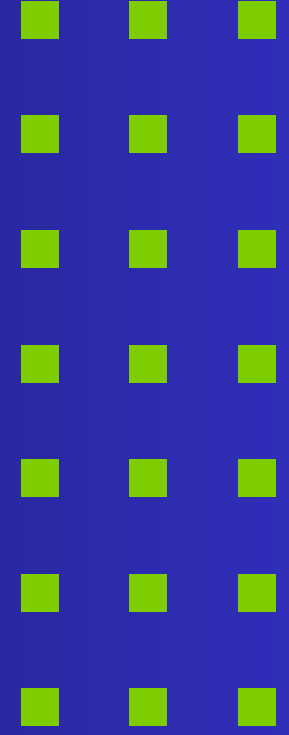
